Going Mediaeval at Beverley .

On our last day in Yorkshire, thanks to dismal weather we had to revise our plans. And how glad I was! Instead we travelled to Beverley, and after browsing round a variety of small shops in the old town (now pedestrianized) we spent a lovely afternoon in the Minster (it's free!!).

It was founded as a monastery by John of Beverley (later canonized) in the 7th century, and we were able to learn his story in beautiful panels embroidered by members of the local branch of the Embroiderers Guild. The variety of stitches and the designs and patterns were wonderful.

I was also fortunate that 'Through the Looking Glass' an exhibition of images allowed us to *'enter the opulent world of the 16th century through the eyes of Petrus Alamire – musical scribe, composer, singer and producer of some of the most decorated illustrated choirbooks in history.'* and our walk round the whole minster was accompanied by his music. This was centred in a black covered *'media-installation 'Speculum Musurgica' by the Belgian contemporary artist Rudi Knoops to*

hear the music so artfully illustrated.' by screens and mirrors so that the recorded singers could be seen individually and in mirror image.

Finally I discovered a quilted altar frontal, in which the design was produced by copying the block design of the chancel floor!
