Once this has taken place, we at St Peter's will be able to change the time of the Sunday Eucharist, originally moved to 9.30am when the parishes were joined. It was agreed by the PCC that the new time should be 10am, thus allowing our more elderly and infirm a little more morning time, while also still allowing time for coffee, which we consider to be an important part of our community.
