These framed goldwork pieces have been taken from a badly rotted altar frontal found in the vestry. Dating from the Victorian period, and because of the thistles, we assume that they came from the closure of St Andrew's church which once stood at the south end of the present day Pelham bridge.



They have been remounted, repaired and framed in antique style 3D frames with glass fronts.

Because of their antique importance they are being sold for church funds at **£20** each, and will be made to order. There are only 6 thistles and 5 roses available, so will be first come, first served.
