Did you know?

Despite detailed accounts of the arrest and trials of Jesus, not one of them gives the gory details of the crucifixion.

Mel Gibson, the director of the film 'The Passion of the Christ' used his own hands as those nailing Jesus to the cross, in order to show that he was part of the reason Jesus had to die.

Similarly Rembrandt painted himself into the crowd round the cross to show Jesus' death involved him.

Coincidentally an ex pupil told me this week of an incident I had forgotten. My description of crucifixion was so graphic that one of the girls in the class fainted!
