

Church Waste Paper Collection Scheme and what comes next!

Many of you will know that All Saints' Church in Winterton has benefited over many years from the income derived from the waste paper collections. However, North Lincolnshire Council has decided that they will no longer make the discretionary recycling payment. But they have extended their deadline to include our planned June collection.



The final collection of waste paper will be as usual on Saturday 23 June.

Please make it a bumper final collection! After that please do not save paper for the church but instead put it in the blue boxes to be collected by the council. Thank you to all those many supporters in our community who have helped us over so many years. But please read on as we hope you will now help us by collecting other things.

There is good news for the church as we have an alternative for which we need your help. Frank Jervis and Robin Shawyer were invited to a meeting at the Civic Centre in Scunthorpe on 16 May at which Cllr Elaine Marper and Cllr Rob Waltham made some suggested alternatives which may provide the church with a greater income than that received from the waste paper.

We will now start collecting textiles and, probably second hand books, instead of waste paper. The textiles can be of any sort – there are no restrictions. For these items the council will provide us with a recycling payment and we may also get a market price payment from a contractor.

So please do start collecting textiles and second hand books now!

The details of the scheme have yet to be worked out but we hope to have the plans ready to appear in the July parish magazine.
