WINTERTON PAR/8/1	<u>Deedpoll of grant</u> John Supp' of Winterton to John Kirkeby, chaplain. Property: an annual rent of 26 shillings issuing from a messuage, 2 tofts and 2 bovates of land in Winterton, which Kirkby has conveyed to him, and the right during his lifetime to stable one horse in the stable attached to the messuage. Endorsement of delivery of seizin.	26 Feb 1416
WINTERTON PAR/8/2	<u>Deedpoll of grant by way of trust</u> Peter Morley of Winterton to Henry Ashewyn and Henry Bellhered. Property: three quarters of a bovate of arable, meadow and pasture usually called Foxley Landes, held of the manor of Kirton Lindsey for an annual payment of 5 shillings. The grantees are to hold the land in trust for the grantor for life and afterwards for Anthony Holland and his heirs, failing whom for Peter Holland and his heirs, failing whom the grantor's sister Elizabeth and her heirs. Signed and sealed by grantor. On the dorse is an extract from the Kirton court rolls of a bargain and sale of the same property by James Poppelwell to John Morley.	26 May 1544
