
Larger groups by prior arrangement. Guided tours available on request.

Public Transport - The 350 Humber Fastcat bus (Hull to Scunthorpe) provides a frequent service via Winterton


Toilets can be found in Queen Street and in the Church

WANDER around this this large medieval church and find out about its history by reading the information bats, free leaflets or listen to a commentary on your smartphone.

- SEE the parish funeral bier purchased in 1882.
- LEARN about Beatrice Franke, an anchoress, who was walled up in a cell on the north side of the church in 1436.
- . SEE the wonderful stained glass windows and discover the stories behind them.

Heritage Room displays

VISIT our Heritage Room and learn more about Winterton, its history, and its development. Examine the old maps, listen to the sounds of the rare collection of west gallery instruments and search our digital archive.

NOTE the magnificent screen (reredos) which once stood behind the altar. See the painting by the 18th century German artist Mengs, who, in his day, was widely regarded as Europe's greatest living painter!
