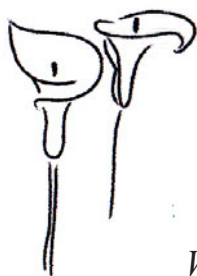

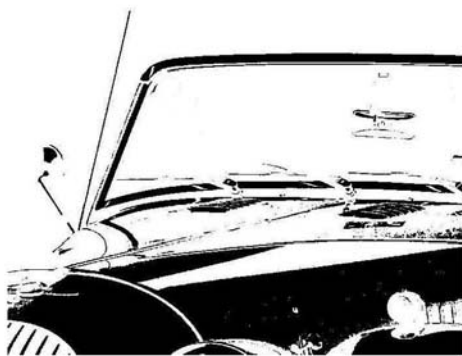

Message from our Local Church Pastor

Looking back

It always fascinates me and brings me great joy to look at old photos and see how we all used to look in days gone by. Those old campervans and the fun we used to have with them. The places we went, remote wild camping and discovering new landscapes and seascapes. The offshore island in the Solway Firth which our children loved to walk across to at low tide. And to look on through 40 years of snaps and see how our children have grown into the lovely people they are, and have been taking their own children on adventures to favourite places and creating their own memories.

The Jewish people used to look back and remember how God had blessed them and delivered them in time past. One famous Psalm reads:

- 1 Bless the LORD, O my soul,
and all that is within me,
bless his holy name.
- 2 Bless the LORD, O my soul,
and do not forget all his benefits
- 3 who forgives all your iniquity,
who heals all your diseases,
- 4 who redeems your life from the Pit,
who crowns you with steadfast love and mercy,
- 5 who satisfies you with good as long as you live
so that your youth is renewed like the eagle's. (from Ps 103)

... Looking back positively is about 'Do not forget all His benefits'.

I keep a journal and when life gets me down I look back through it and see the occasions when God answered the prayers I made, usually in ways I didn't expect. There I discover again that He is an ever faithful God who never lets me down, and I put my journal away again breathing a 'thankyou' to God for all His goodness.

Recently my dear old Mum went to be with the Lord. We recalled how on 4th Jan this year 14 of us surprised Mum at home, took her to a nearby car park overlooking the North Sea and she watched with delight as the children played, and enjoyed conversations as we took it in turns to sit in with her. Laughter completed the day as the car she was in had to be pushed off because the tunes playing had drained the battery. All this is recorded in my journal and Mum's diary. And there's the photos too. If we're in danger of forgetting we can go and look again....look back and remember the goodness of God.

Some either got a phone call or nothing at all and deliveries have been stopped without notice. Customers at the Coop are still leaving items in our collecting bin. Thank you to all for their support and generosity.

Councillor Paul McCartan also keeps in touch with redirecting donations of goods. He has also informed us that Winterton Town Council has agreed to donate £500 to The Poirier Foundation so we can continue helping Winterton residents.

Matt says: " Plans are in place to run this years Winterton show 10 mile race as a virtual race, basically you have between Monday 28th June and Sunday 5th July to run a 10 mile time trial and submit your time. There is No fee for the virtual race but if you would like to make a voluntary donation to this years race charity it will be appreciated."

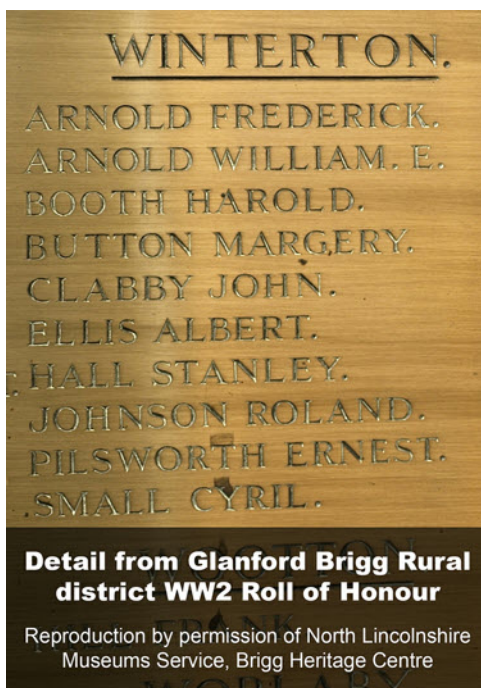

Winterton Virtual Open Gardens Weekend

Sadly a decision to cancel the 'real' event was made early on in the 'lockdown' when it became clear that planning could not take place and there was no guarantee that it could be safely held under social distancing and other guidelines. Each year it has been held it has created significant interest and it has also contributed much badly needed funding to All Saints' Church in Winterton.

In its place All Saints has arranged a Winterton Virtual Open Gardens Weekend on 18-19th July, 2020. It will be an online collection of photos and short videos of gardens in Winterton. Any Winterton resident is encouraged to submit images/videos which can cover a range of ideas. There will be a link to the All Saints online fundraising page so that those who view the site online will have the opportunity to make donations if they wish. Those who submit images/videos are asked to email family and friends to view the site when it is online that weekend.

You are invited to submit images/videos. Please upload images/photos to www.wintertonopengardens.co.uk before July 14th. Click login on the top menu bar then select register. This is also the link to send to those who wish to see the final 'show' over the weekend 18-19 July.

Things you need to know about the images/videos required [any questions call 734285]:

1. They must be taken in a garden/allotment or of a houseplant/window box in Winterton.
2. They may be taken at any time of the year.
3. They may show your favourite view [part of the garden, a close-up of a favourite plant or an aspect of wildlife in the garden] or anything which sparks your interest and gives you joy.
4. Short videos [ideally no more than 60 seconds] might show a walk in your garden or you carrying out gardening tasks.
5. Other ideas are possible such as before and after photos showing changes you have made to the garden or time-lapse images showing a blossom opening. Give your imagination free rein!
6. Each image/video to have your name and a title. If possible add a short sentence or two to indicate what is special/joyful about each image/video. We want to share happy thoughts as widely as we can!
7. Upload your entry before July 14th, 2020 so that there is time to create the site online. Details of special Facebook page later.
8. All Saints will retain final editorial control of which images are placed on its web pages.
9. Contact your family and friends and ask them to view the site on 18-19 July. If possible ask them to offer online donations to All Saints at Winterton as the real fundraising Open Gardens event had to be cancelled.

Stories of some stained glass windows in All Saints, Winterton

Chancel South Wall: Middle Window [image left]

Plaque beneath says:

To the Glory of God and in memory of William Hollingworth Driffill of Winterton Hall who died on the 7th of June 1867 and of Elizabeth his wife who died on the 22nd of February 1876 and of Jane Driffill their daughter who died on the first of February 1863.

The story by Canon JT Fowler from our parish magazine archive: 'In the next window, which is a single lancet light, are three compartments representing Our Lord instructing His Church.

1. In His Own Person, teaching the people from the ship, which is drawn up by the shore on which the hearers are sitting in attitudes of attention. The figure of Our Lord is striking and dignified, as he holds up His right hand, pointing to higher things. St. Matt. XIII, 1, 2.
2. The Parable of the Sower, the incident selected being that of the fowls of the air devouring the seed that fell on the beaten path. St. Matt. XIII, 3-8.
3. Our Lord continuing to teach [see Acts I, 1] by His Disciples on the Day of Pentecost, as He has done ever since by His Church. The particular subject is that of St. Peter preaching the first Christian Sermon. As in the other window, he holds a book, and his right hand is raised as in animated discourse. The light from heaven is indicated above, and the cloven tongues of fire rest on the heads of the Apostles. Acts II.'

Chancel South Wall: West Window[image next page]

In Memory of Joseph B. Sadler for 46 years surgeon in this place. B. 1809 D. 1879.





The story from our parish magazine archive: 'The next window was presented by the late Mrs Sadler many years ago in memory of her husband. The three compartments represent three incidents taken from the Parable of the Good Samaritan, which speak for themselves. The arms below the transom are those of the Sadler family.'

The window was designed by Messrs Clayton & Bell of London, a highly successful firm who made excellent designs. There is much detail about the company at http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Clayton_and_Bell

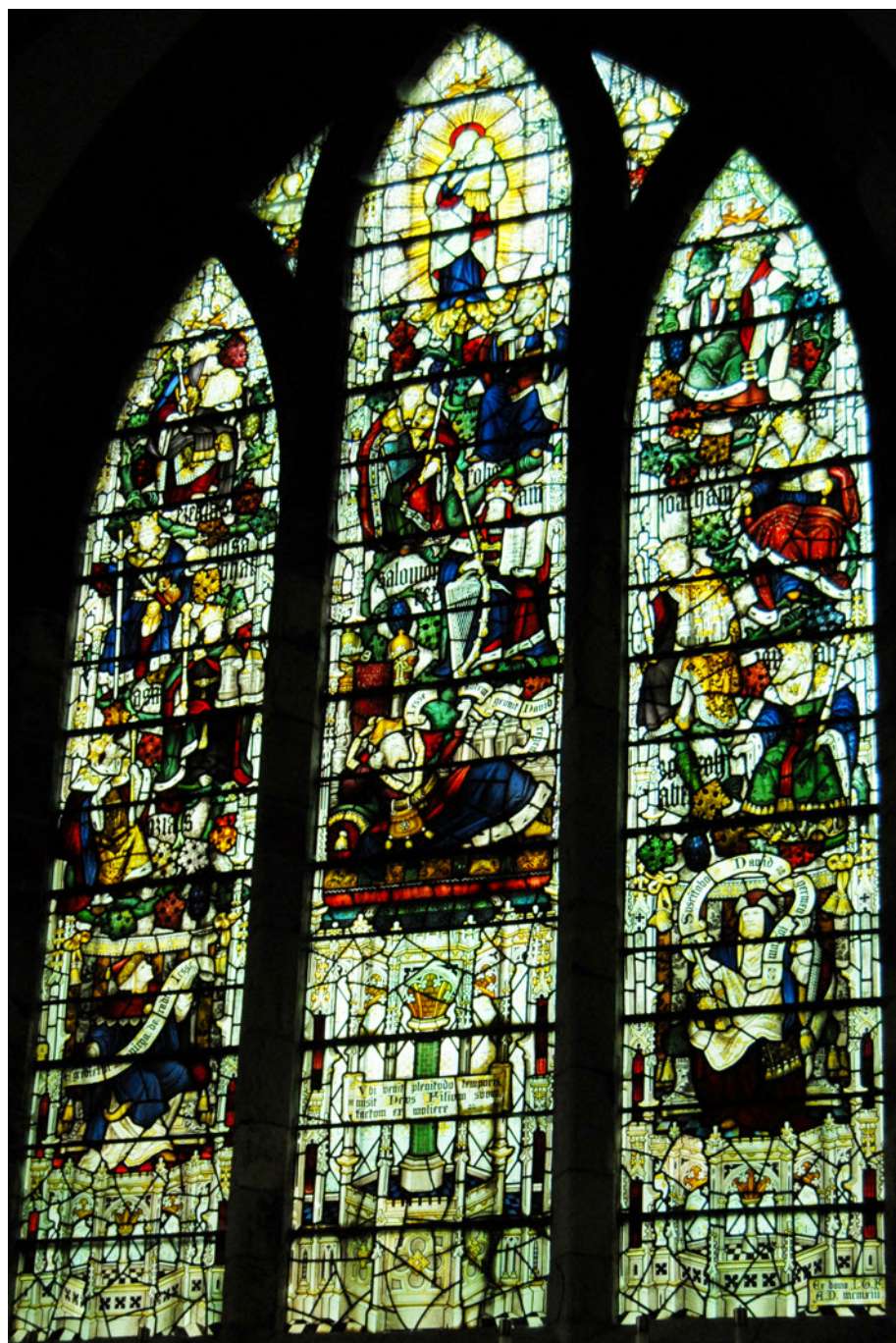
Chancel East Window [image opposite]

The East window behind the high altar in the Chancel was installed in 1913 by C.E. Kempe and Co. Ltd. The window was donated by Canon JT Fowler who lived at 'The Chains' in West Street. There is a very small inscription written in Latin on the lower right hand glass panel which states 'Ex dono ITF AD mcmiii' which translates as 'Donated by JTF 1913'. Canon Fowler wrote in the parish magazine about the biblical stories shown in several of the windows.

For the East window he wrote:

'The subject represented in this window is the Dream of Jesse, in which he is imagined as foreseeing in one of his posterity the promised Messiah. The usual mode of treatment is to represent Jesse asleep, with his more prominent descendants on branches of a vine issuing from beside him, and with the Blessed Virgin and her Divine Infant at the top. This design is called the Tree of Jesse, and for many hundreds of years, and all over Europe, has been a very favourite subject for painted glass, sculpture, etc. The east windows of Selby Abbey Church and of Carlisle Cathedral are well known ancient examples, and, being of very great size, they include a very great number of figures and kindred subjects. Still the general idea is the same in all, and in our new east window at Winterton, Mr Tower, the successor of Mr Kemp, has carried it out in that beautiful design and colouring for which Mr Kemp was so long celebrated.

In the lower part of the central compartment Jesse appears as asleep, and with the text "Jesse begat David the King." Over him is David with his ten-stringed harp and a book open with the words from Psalm 89, verse 27, "He shall call me, Thou art my



Father." Over David is Solomon in all his glory, with a book lettered inside, "The Book of Wisdom." Over him, Rehoboam as King. On the north side, at the foot, Isaiah looking upward, with text, "There shall come a rod out of the stem of Jesse." Over him, Uzziah, as King. Over him, Asa, with one of the fortified cities he built, and the words

"City of Refuge." Over him Jehoshaphat with a sword, and over him Hezekiah with the sun-dial. On the south side, at the foot, Jeremiah with the words "I will raise to David a righteous Branch." Then Zerubbabel with the second Temple. Over him, Joram as King, then Joatham, and lastly Josiah with the roll of the Law that Hilkiah found during the repairs of the temple. The top of the window is occupied by the figure of the Blessed Virgin with the Infant Jesus, to whom the whole design leads up.'

Chancel North Wall: West Window [see left]

In loving memory of Robert Fowler, Priest, and of Eliza Juliet, his wife. This window is dedicated AD 1913.

The story from our parish magazine archive:

'The new side window in the chancel is another beautiful work by Mr Tower, and, as the inscription says, it is dedicated in memory of two former parishioners. The lower subject is that of the three Maries met by the Angels at the empty tomb, with the text "He is not here, He is risen." Above this we see represented Christ's charge to St. Peter, "Feed my sheep," and at the top, two Angels with Alleluias.

In both the windows [this and the East Window] is inserted in one unobtrusive manner the device or cognizance of Mr Tower, namely a sheaf, which was used by Mr Kemp, surmounted by a Tower, alluding to his own name.' Mr Tower was Walter Tower who took over as chairman of the famous London based firm of C.E. Kempe and Co. Ltd when Mr Kemp [Charles Eamer Kempe] died in 1907. He was the younger cousin of Mr Kempe. There is much information about this company and its work at

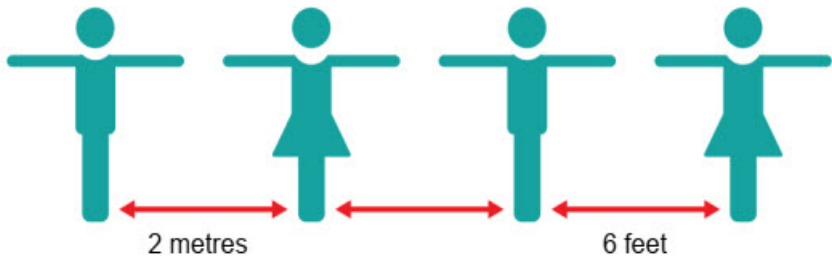

Open for Private Prayer

Revd Alice opened All Saints at Winterton for private prayer on Wednesday 17th June and will continue to open on Wednesdays from 2-4pm during the lockdown. Please do check the church website in case of last minute changes. As many of our Open Church team are shielding at present we cannot yet operate our normal Open Church rota on both Wednesdays and Saturdays.

Measures are in place to keep to government safety guidelines. Currently there is a maximum in the church of 10 people at any one time. Hand sanitiser is available on entry and you may wear a face mask if you wish to do so. There are safety guidelines inside the entry door and you are asked to keep your distance at all times in the church whether seated or walking around.



The toilet is available for use but users are asked to follow the guidelines such as washing hands with soap for 20 seconds before and after using toilet; avoid, if possible, touching surfaces with your hands; after use please use gloves and materials provided to clean the toilet bowl, washbasin and hard surfaces. There is a supply of materials to facilitate all these measures. We hope in this way to ensure health and safety of all those entering the building.

Worship at All Saints, Winterton

At the time of writing we are still awaiting the decision from the government and the Church of England about whether or not churches will open for worship from early July. If this is possible we will put notices on the church website and the noticeboard in the churchyard to make our plans clear. Details will then be available in the August magazine.

Sunday services from All Saints have been streamed on Facebook and YouTube for several Sundays in June. It is likely that these will continue to be streamed even after the church re-opens for normal worship as there will be some in our community who will wish to be very cautious about the continuing presence of coronavirus. For the current time the 10.45am Sunday service can be accessed on the Facebook page of All Saints, Winterton.

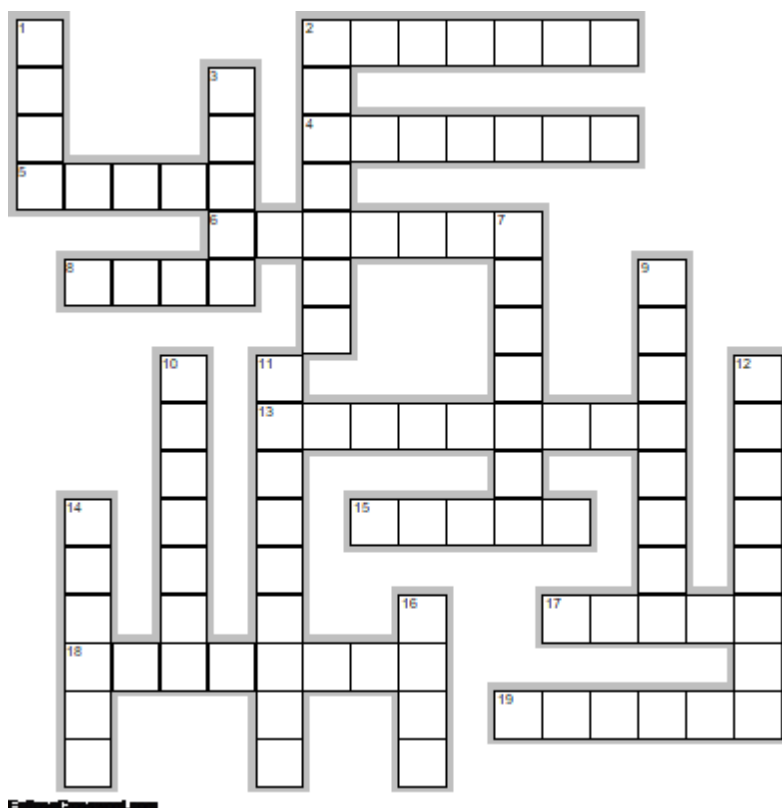

Reopening of church buildings for public worship

Following the Government announcement that church buildings will be able to reopen for public worship from 4th July, providing physical distancing remains in place, the Bishop of London, Sarah Mullally, who leads the Church of England's Recovery Group, said: "I welcome the Prime Minister's announcement today that we will soon be able to begin to meet and worship together in our church buildings again.

The last three months have been an extraordinary time - the first period without public worship and the sacraments in England in more than 800 years. There will be real joy as we begin to come together again – if even at a physical distance – but I also know that many will be understandably cautious at this news.

We will not be returning to normality overnight - this is the next step on a journey. We've been planning carefully, making detailed advice available for parishes to enable them to prepare to hold services when it is safe and practical to do so. It is important to say that the change in Government guidance is permissive, not prescriptive.

I would particularly like to thank clergy and lay leaders for all they have done during the time our buildings have been closed. Not all church buildings will be ready to hold regular services from July 4th, but we are providing whatever support we can to enable them.

There will still be restrictions and we must all still do everything we can to limit the spread of the virus to protect each other, especially the most vulnerable. The online services and dial-in worship offerings we have become used to will continue. This has been an incredibly difficult time for the whole country, especially for those who have been ill, who have suffered financial hardship, the loss of livelihoods and indeed, for many, those they love. We know that is not over and the Church has a task ahead to bring consolation and hope.

Churches and cathedrals have risen to the recent challenges, finding new ways of meeting for worship, of serving our neighbours, and of reaching new people with the love of God. The challenge before us now is to take the next steps carefully and safely, without forgetting all that we've discovered about God and ourselves on the way." Detailed advice for parishes will be updated, as necessary, in the coming days to reflect the detail of the Government guidance once published.

Weddings will be able to resume, along with other services. The Church of England Recovery Group will also issue advice on subjects including singing and music for which a review by Public Health England is currently in progress.

The Winterton Group of churches will await this further guidance before making any decision. For All Saints at Winterton details will be placed on the churchyard noticeboard.
