The Season of Lent

Lent is the solemn religious observance in the Christian liturgical calendar that began on Ash Wednesday when some of us came to the Holy Eucharist and had the sign of the cross placed on our foreheads (made from the ashes of last year's palm crosses) with the words "Remember that dust thou art, and to dust thou shalt return". Lent is for the Christian's preparation for Easter through prayer, doing penance. repentance of sins, almsgiving, and self-denial. Lent lasts for the forty days, in which we remember the days Jesus spend in the desert fasting and three Gospels describe how he resisted temptation by the devil. Strictly speaking Lent ends on the evening of Holy Thursday at the Eucharist which commemorates the Institution of the Holy Sacrament at the Last Supper. We then strip the Altars and remove all ornaments to make the church bare ready to commemorate the Passion of Our Lord on Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Easter Saturday when we bring in the New Light of Easter Day and light the new Paschal Candle. We are then ready to Celebrate the Glorious Resurrection of Our Lord. Sundays in Lent are not considered part of the Lenten Fast according to the table at the beginning of the Book of Common Prayer and neither is any major Feast Day (of a saint) in Lent considered a Fast Day. The BCP has always held the traditional "Fish on Friday" as a Fast Day.

Our team will open Winterton church from 2-4pm on all Saturday afternoons and the first and fourth Wednesday afternoons in each month.


The Lord In Whom We Put Our Faith.

The Eucharist affects the life of our Christian communities, and is where the Church receives her identity and mission. It is something that Christ does for us, filling us with his grace and nourishing us with His own life and is not simply a memorial of what Jesus did for us. Jesus gave Himself to all on the Cross, so we are called to give ourselves generously to our brothers and sisters, sharing in their joys and sorrows. The Eucharist gives us the grace to feel forgiven and to be ready to forgive others. In the Eucharist we experience the forgiveness of God, and our hearts are enlarged to receive and show mercy.

Say this antiphon as your own personal prayer as we wait quietly for the Eucharist.

A reading from the book of Genesis

15: 1-12. 17-18

God enters into a Covenant with Abraham, the man of faith.

The word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision, 'Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great.' But Abram said, 'O Lord GOD, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?' And Abram said, 'You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir.' But the word of the LORD came to him, 'This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir.' He brought him outside and said, 'Look towards heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your descendants be.' And he believed the LORD: and the LORD reckoned it to him as righteousness. Then he said to him. 'I am the LORD who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess.' But he said, 'O Lord GOD, how am I to know that I shall possess it?' He said to him, 'Bring me a heifer three years old, a female goat three years old, a ram three years old, a turtle-dove, and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these and cut them in two, laying each half over against the other; but he did not cut the birds in two. And when birds of prey came down on the carcasses, Abram drove them away. As the sun was going down, a deep sleep fell upon Abram, and a deep and terrifying darkness descended upon him. When the sun had gone down and it was dark, a smoking fire-pot and a flaming torch passed between these pieces. On that day the LORD made a covenant with Abram, saying, 'To your descendants I give this land, from the river of Egypt to the great river, the river Euphrates.'
